Regular weekly attendance

Church is a place to worship God together, be equipped for living out your faith, and grow together as disciples of Christ.

Do ten Jesus things

Which 10 intentional things will you do this year following Jesus' example? E.g. support the food pantry, commit to and connect with a neighbour regularly, volunteer with Youth or kids etc.



Bring one Friend

As a lively church we always have opportunities to invite friends to. From one of our 3 regular services, to our seasonal events and socials. We want you to bring at least one friend to one event this year.



Rule of Life



CALLED TO:



Develop a pattern of prayer including daily encounter/quiet time with God (10 mins minimum), and joining in the corporate prayer life of the church. Praying for your five friends to come to know Jesus. (We offer termly prayer gatherings, weekly intercession prayer group on Wednesdays, and morning prayer).

Reading or engaging with the Bible daily through apps, audio or a physical Bible. (e.g. bible in one year, lectio 365, YouVersion)





Going deeper in faith, using other Christian materials, learning together as part of a Connect group, deeper study of the Bible personally and corporately.

(The Vicar's lending bookshelf and a variety of Bible study groups are available, just reach out to the office for more info).

SENT TO:

Not being ashamed of the good news that Jesus saves, give an account of what you believe and why. To talk openly with your friends about your relationship with Jesus. (We want you to invite them to one of our events, services or Alpha.)







Serving in at least one way or ministry within St Mark's, as well as growing in serving others outside the church. (e.g. Children's, Youth, Welcome, Refreshments, T.A.N.G.O, Pantry, PA, Visuals)

Regular sacrificial giving of effort, time and money. (The Church of England has recommended members give 5% of their income to the local church and 5% to other charities. Ask the Lord what He wants you to give)
